Additional Details...

- **Student:** apply to the college directly.
- **Student:** submit required materials (SAT scores, GPA, high school transcript, and/or letters of recommendation).
- **Student:** Take entrance testing if requested to assess student readiness for the program.
- **Family:** pay college related fees, which are reduced for qualifying high school students (as low as \$100 per credit).
- **CCA :** provide transcripts once student requests they be sent to the school.

Who is Eligible (Continued)?

Programs for Qualifying Seniors

Academic Scholars (up to 2 courses per semester):

- GPA of 3.5 or higher
- Early release or late arrival are options
- One study hall per course, wifi access, and a laptop at CCA for college coursework
- 3 or more courses will be taken at CCA each semester
- Discounted tuition

Early Start (3+ college courses per semester, no daily attendance at CCA):

- GPA of 3.5 or higher
- B or above in junior year DE course
- A minimum of 22 completed high school credits
- Ability to meet all core requirements with college credits by Dec. of graduation year
- Acceptance to a college program allowing 9+ credits per semester
- Fulfills all HS credits at a college and carries a minimum of 9 credits per semester
- Approved project for CCA Open House
- Attends graduation, student is eligible for academic and athletic related awards
- May participate in CCA trips, parties, and athletics
- Discounted tuition

Who is Eligible?

- **Academically advanced juniors and seniors are encouraged to participate in Dual Enrollment with an accredited college.**

Juniors:

- Eligible for 1 DE course per semester with a GPA of 3.5 or higher during 9th and 10th grade year
- No early release/late arrival
- A minimum of 5 courses taken at CCA (typical CCA student takes 6 or more)
- One study hall, wifi access, and a laptop at CCA for college coursework
- An A or B in DE course(s) and a minimum of 22 high school graduation credits is required to be eligible for Early Start program in Senior Year
- Exceptions to the guidelines must have approval of the administration

Seniors participating in First DE Course:

- Same as Juniors, but GPA is 3.0 or higher



Steps for Dual Enrollment:

1. In grades 9-11, maintain a **GPA of 3.5 or higher** (to be eligible Junior year) or a **GPA of 3.0 or higher** (to be eligible Senior year).
2. Tell Miss Califf about your interest to pursue DE.
3. **Research and find the best college/university Dual Enrollment fit for you.** This could be an online or on-campus course, make sure the school is accredited (should be posted on the website).
4. **Apply directly to the college's DE program** (let Miss Califf know if you need help finding this link on their site).
5. **Complete and submit necessary paperwork to finalize application** (i.e. testing, orientation, etc.).
6. **Let CCA know what courses you are taking so your schedule can be finalized.**
7. Start the class and reach out when you need help!
8. **At the end of the course, give a copy of the college transcript to CCA so it can be added to your HS transcript.**

When applying to colleges, send CCA and college transcripts!

Why should I take DE Courses?

- Access to college level resources
- Save time and money by getting ahead with courses
- Expand choice of electives—take something that CCA doesn't offer and help narrow down field of study for after HS

Expectations for All DE Students:

- College transcripts are given to CCA within 1 week of posting and courses are recorded as Honors on CCA transcript.
- Behavior and Academic issues can affect eligibility for DE.
- When college course is taught from a secular perspective, an academic advisor is assigned to meet with the student to discuss how a Christian worldview affects the topic of study. The student is responsible for keeping a weekly journal of questions for discussion.
